



News from the Board – July 2009

2009 AGM Planning gets underway

This year's AGM and Board election is the first that will be held according to the constitution adopted by the members at our 2008 AGM.

Latest details re the 2009 AGM are on the AGM pages of our website at <http://www.bicyclensw.org.au/content/agm>. The management team are investigating how our new on line membership system will be used to allow on line participation and voting consistent with the new rules. Full details will be on the website soon after nominations to the Board close on 15th September 2009.

2009 Board Elections

A key activity at the AGM is the ballot for election to the Board. This year members will be able to vote on line in the period leading up to the AGM or at the AGM itself. The ballot will be for at least 4 Board positions that will fall due according to clause 56.3 of the constitution.

The nomination form is now available on the AGM pages of the website. We plan, as in previous years, to complement the nomination form by providing candidates with an opportunity to publish details of relevant skills and experience and respond to a standard set of questions intended to show why they will be effective in the role of Board member.

Under the new rules, a key and early responsibility of continuing and newly elected Board members will be to appoint two new Board members "as soon as possible" in accordance with rule 56.4.

With this in mind the current Board are looking ahead and doing some thinking about what might be the appropriate criteria for choosing the two appointed Board members to help the next Board be as effective as possible.

It was great to hear about this scheme and as always we welcome the opportunity for input and discussion with our members.
